RE: ADAM STRAIN

Adam is doing very well on his dialysis. We have adjusted the volume of the dialysis fluid on his automatic cycler to improve his chemistry over the Christmas period and we will be looking at that again today.

He should continue on his usual treatment:-

Sodium Bicarbonate 12.5mls of 8.4% solution 4 times a day Ferromyn 4mls daily One Alpha 3mls daily Keflex 125mgs at night Erythropoietin 750 units twice a week Ketovite Tablets 1 three times a week

He is also on gastrostomy tube feeds using mainly Nutrizon supplemented with Calogen and Maxijul to which he also has added 100mls of normal saline because of a tendency to salt loss through his residual kidney. We have stopped his Kay-Cee-L as his potassium has been a little bit on the high side.
