RE: ADAM STRAIN DOB 4.8.91

Adam was up at the clinic this morning. He has been very well for the last fortnight since we discontinued his antibiotic. He got a temperature after we changed his gastrostomy tube and we think we probably caused a bacteraemia. He is due to come to Theatre again next week to have an orchidopexy done and his mum was keen to get him back to having a gastrostomy corpak button which is easier to manage than the tube. The surgeons have agreed to do that on that day.

Otherwise from the point of view of his renal condition we are not changing any of his treatment today. He continues on his dialysis 15 cycles of 750 ml and on prophylactic Keflex at night, iron supplements, One-Alpha Vitamin D, Sodium Bicarbonate 12.5 ml 4 times a day, Erythropoietin 1000 units twice a week, Cisapride and Zantac.

We will see him again obviously when he is in hospital next week.
