Adam was reviewed at the Renal Out-Patient Clinic on 13th October, 1992. He was recently at hospital with a proven urinary tract infection and has been on Ciproxin for the past four days. His form is now much better, his temperature is normal and the only problem is that he is reluctant to eat. [REDACTED]

On examination today his blood pressure was normal and I could find no new problems on examination. We checked his renal function tests today.

The mother is to finish his course of Ciproxin and then put him back on prophylactic Keflex. We will be checking his urine in the near future and we will review him at the clinic in one week's time.
