Questions on death of Lucy Crawford

1. Why was a post-mortem at the Royal conducted, given that agreement had been reached with the Coroner about what should be stated on Lucy's death certificate as the cause of death?
2. Why was the Coroner not alerted that the Royal was carrying out a post mortem at the hospital?
3. Why was the Coroner not informed of the results of the post mortem, given its findings?
4. Why is the clinical history in the Post Mortem report at odds with the clinical history given to the coroner at the time of Lucy's death?
5. The clinical history given to Mr. Leckey on April 14th is "(1) cerebral oedema, (2) dehydration and (3) gastroenteritis." How was this conclusion reached? What the extent of the input from the Erne Hospital?
