





All participants were in agreement that DRGP should be progressed on a regional basis. It was felt that both the remit of the Regional Strategic Group and the Management Group should be carefully considered. For the Regional, in addition to GPs and departmental representation, it was considered that there was a need to have both epidemiological/academic expertise to drive the work of the steering group. It was proposed, therefore, that Professor Frank Kee and Dr Brian Smyth should be considered for membership of the steering group, in addition to Dr Brid Farrell from the Southern Board and Dr Dennis Boyd from the Northern Board. Dr Stewart highlighted the importance of having Mr Mark Eustice, who was involved in this project in the Eastern Board, on the group.

It was agreed that Dr David Stewart would put together priorities from a Board perspective, taking account of priorities identified, for example, in certain chronic diseases, communicable diseases and cancer. To this end it was considered that Dr Stewart may wish to contact individuals such as Dr Anna Gavin from the Cancer Registry, Dr Brian Smyth from the Communicable Disease Surveillance Centre, Dr Brid Farrell and Dr Richard Smithson, both public health physicians in the Southern and Western Board respectively.

It was also suggested that there should be some information/IT input from the Boards into the Management Group and, in addition to this, Mr Eugene Gallagher's name, from the Western Board, was proposed for the Management Group.
