I am sure my readers will be interested to note that the Health Minister ³cannot spare the time² to talk about the case of a little child who died as a result of still unexplained mistakes in one of her hospitals.

I think it is time that we ended this charade of correspondence. I, as an individual journalist, as well as this newspaper, and thereby the readers in the west of the Province have been treated shabbily and disgracefully by you and your department.

May I remind you that it is six weeks tomorrow since I began seeking an interview with the Minister, and despite repeated requests in the intervening period, the Minister has 'spared the time' to undertake a number of other engagements.

Unfortunately, an innocent child's life would not appear to be high on your list of priorities.

In our telephone conversation of Tuesday, 6th April, you said 3We1re not running away from this, 2 and you also suggested I 3doorstep2 the Minister. I note the Minister has not been in my area since, and the series of e-mails between us in the intervening period lead me to suspect, at least, that someone is ³running away from this. ²

Opinion of courtesy, I have to inform you that I now intend to go public with o' correspondence in an article in the Impartial Reporter, which will also lighlight the Minister's reluctance to address the concerns of the Crawford family and the public crisis of confidence in local health management.
