Adam is doing very well on his dialysis. His urea has crept up a bit but I think this is because his renal function has deteriorated quite rapidly even though he has gone on dialysis. His creatinine was 620 at his last visit whereas when he went on dialysis it was only 540.

I therefore have not changed his treatment just at present. We will continue with his current dialysis regimen and of course all his drugs:-

Sodium Bicarbonate, Iron supplement, One-Alpha, Keflex, Kay-Cee-L, Erythropoietin, Ketovite and saline supplements as before.

As you know he also receives tube feeds and gets about 1500 calories, mainly in the form of Nutrizon, from that.
