Adam is now on his dialysis every day. There was some concern that his creatinine had not gone down dramatically on his P.D. regime although in fact his urea was very well controlled at 8 with an increased protein intake. I am actually quite happy with his current dialysis regime and I think that probably when we see his results today he will be able to have just the dialysis five or six days a week and still remain well.

As you know he is on multiple other medications because of his renal problems and the only one of these we have changed since I last wrote to you is that I want to increase his One-Alpha vitamin D to 3mls which is 0.6mcg daily. This is because his serum calcium is still a little bit on the low side at 2.23 and we want to make sure that his bones remain strong.
