RE: ADAM STRAIN

Adam has been up at the hospital a couple of times recently. He came up on Sunday because he had a temperature which was quite high. He was in bad form and his urine was cloudy. We treated him for a urine infection with Ciproxin 125mgs twice a day. He got better quite quickly in fact and is in good form this morning. His mum says his temperature settled really within twenty-four hours. We are repeating his urine culture today and if that is clear he can return to his usual prophylactic Keflex.

There are a couple of other problems that we need to get sorted out. One is that he still has a Foley Catheter and he has a temporary gastrostomy tube and also he has an undescended testis which he has been waiting to get fixed. I have spoken to Mr.Boston this morning and he has put him on his urgent waiting list which means he will have this done during October.

I also had a message, via his mum, from the Clinical Medical Officer, Dr. Burns, about his school wanting more information. I will contact her sometime this week. I am not quite sure what more information she needs.

I will see Adam again in a month's time, if not before.
