

RE: ADAM STRAIN

Adam was up at the clinic today. He is looking the picture of health as usual. His last results were very satisfactory. His haemoglobin had gone up to 10.8, his urea was slightly down at 19.5. and his bone profile is satisfactory.

He should therefore continue on his current dialysis regime 600mls fifteen cycles a night and his usual drug treatment with Erythropoietin 750 units twice a week, Fersamal 4mls daily as an iron supplement, prophylactic Keflex, One-Alpha 0.6mcg daily, and Sodium Bicarbonate supplements. I am going to stop the Sodium Bicarbonate supplements before his next visit to see if he still needs these as it seems rather unlikely.

We have checked his blood tests again today and will see him again in one month.
