INJECTION OF CONTRAST VIA URETEROSTOMY TUBE

The anatomy following anastomosis of the left ureter to the right ureter is as shown. On this occasion there is no evidence of any leak at the anastomosis.

There was, however, no evidence of passage of contrast into the bladder suggesting obstruction at the vesico ureteric junction.

MATERIAL INTO THE SPINAL CANAL. ON THIS OCCASION THERE IS NO
EVIDENCE OF HYDROMYELOCELE. THE LEFT PNEUMOTHORAX IS THE
RESULT OF A PUNCTURE OF THE LEFT PLEURA IN THE
REGION OF THE T10-T11 INTERCOSTAL SPACE.

RENAL ULTRASOUND
The kidneys remain small and brighter than normal. There is no
longer evidence of ascites. There appears to be a localised
fluid collection at the posterior medial aspect of the right kidney
which probably represents a dilated renal pelvis. The bladder is
empty so the pelvic region is difficult to evaluate.

Barium Meal and follow-through There was severe gastro-oesophageal reflux with an associated P.T.S. Each episode of reflux usually ended in a vomit. Gastric emptying occurred normally. No abnormality demonstrated in the duodenum or small bowel.

Ultrasound of pelvis The bladder is thick-walled and is thought to contain some debris around the catheter tip. No free fluid is identified.
