Dear Dr McKee,

I thank you for accepting Lucy for transfer. She presented at approximately 1930 with a history of fever, vomiting and diarrhoea. Capillary refill > 2 sec. T.V. at approx. 1100.

Initial investigation

Hb = 12.1 WBC = 15.0 Platelets = 397

Na⁺ = 137 K⁺ = 4.1 Cl⁻ = 105 CO₂ = 16

urea = 9.9 Glucose = 4.5 Creatinine = 45.

At approx. 0300 her mother noticed her very rigid. She was given diazepam 2.5mg (But it is not likely much was absorbed because of diarrhoea shortly afterwards). There were a number of episodes of diarrhoea - watery & blood & mucus.

She responded (O₂ nets) to bagging and was intubated ~ 0400.

Her pulse was palpable throughout

 from 0330 when I first looked at her

CXR: NAD.

AXR: Distended loops of bowel? colon.
 She had 1gm of Clotrimazole $\approx$ 0500 and
 5gm mannitol $\approx$ 0520 (with a brisk diuresis).
