





# 5. Prevention of Hyponatraemia in Children Receiving Intravenous Fluids

Dr Stewart reported that the Department had approached CREST regarding the dissemination and 'kite marking' of guidelines on the Prevention of Hyponatraemia in Children Receiving Intravenous Fluids. He introduced Dr McCarthy, DHSSPS, who stated that the problem had come to the attention of the Department through clinicians, who reported an increase in the condition and felt in need of urgent guidance. As a result a working group had been quickly convened and comprised Paediatric Anaesthetists and Surgeons, Public Health Medicine, Nursing and Chemical Pathology specialties. The guidelines had been targeted at junior staff and non-specialists and were intended to highlight awareness.

After debate members agreed that the guidelines should be circulated to the relevant specialist in laminated card format with an accompanying letter signed by CMO. It was also agreed that a small working group comprising Drs Russell, Fitzpatrick, Montgomery and Trinick, a Renal Physician and a nurse should be convened to take the initiative forward. Dr Russell agreed to act as Chairman and to arrange a suitable date for the inaugural meeting. Mrs Waddell also felt that the education of nurses on the maintenance of fluid balance needed to be addressed and the matter raised with Nursing Education.








## 9. Guideline Development and Implementation


