Lad Sir Hugh,

You wrote to me on 22 February 2008 about the progress that was being made in investigating the deaths of children who had died from hyponatraemia. In particular you advised that in the case of Claire Roberts further expert opinion was being sought and that you were also consulting with the family.

You will be aware that on 30 May John O'Hara QC announced the resumption of his Inquiry and in particular that two new cases were being added (Claire Roberts and Conor Mitchell).

I have met with both families and in my conversation with the Roberts was given to believe that they had indicated to the PSNI that they would be content for the further investigation of their daughter's death to be undertaken by the Inquiry, although they recognised that the PSNI may first have to complete its own investigation and seek the views of the PPS.

I would be grateful therefore if you could let me know what the present position is with Claire's case. Also, I have been advised by John O'Hara that his Inquiry hopes to do its preparatory work in the autumn for public hearings early in the New Year, so anything that could be done to expedite this case would be greatly appreciated.

Thank you for your attention to this matter.
