This 6 year old girl with severe learning difficulties was reviewed at outpatients on the 2nd November. I was delighted to hear that she has had no convulsions for over two years and she continues to take Epilim 7.5 mls b.d. (300 mg b.d.).

Her mother is experiencing great difficulty in administering the Epilim so I have suggested you prescribe Epilim crushable tablets.

I would like to see Claire convulsion free for a further 12 months before actually weaning her off medication.

We have agreed that Claire should have a chromosome analysis carried out and I will arrange for her to have a CT scan.

I intend reviewing her at the Child Development Clinic when Professor Nevin is present as Mrs. Roberts has many questions to ask.
