I am a consultant paediatrician based at Centrium Hospital. I have been in this post since Feb 2002. Prior to this I was a paediatric specialist registrar for 5 yrs, based throughout N Ireland. 3 or more years were in Belfast, 1 1/2 yrs based in the children's hospital at the Royal. My qualifications are MBBS BAO DCH MRCPCH. On 13/02 I was on call when Lucy Crawford was admitted. I accepted her transfer call which was about 6am in the morning. I was on the ward when Lucy arrived in Intensive Care. She was examined by me around 9am. I spoke to Dr Harvahan who is the consultant paediatric neurologist and requested that he examine Lucy for his opinion. At that time I was based in Dr Harvahan's ward. My name was I told him was based

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on my knowledge after examining Lucy,
~~that she was unconscious and not~~
and I gave him a precise summary.
At this time I cannot remember
exactly what my conversation was.
Because I had been on call I
finished duty on 13400 at lunch
time. I returned to work the following
morning. I have prepared a statement
regarding my involvement with the treatment
of or Lucy Crawford and I agree to
this being typed on a police witness
form which I will then sign.
Detectable Hall has asked me what
I receive feedback from Dr O'Hare,
pathologist following Lucy's post mortem.
I have no recollection of this.
Detectable Hall has asked me about
my conversation with Dr O'Donoghue,
who accompanied Lucy from the scene.
He provided a transfer letter regarding
her admission in the usual way.
I would class this as a standard
transfer letter. Detectable Hall has
asked me about the entry I made
in the medical notes referring to the
coroner. I had no direct contact with
the coroner. I completed the notes

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regarding this conversation and other matters regarding treatment to Lucy as is normal practice. It is very common medical practice for junior staff to be the scribe for seniors.
