	I am a registered medical practitioner. I qualified in 1982. I work as a Consultant Paediatric Anaesthetist in the Royal Belfast Hospital for Sick Children. I was duty consultant at the time Lucy Crawford was admitted. I recall receiving a telephone call from the Erne Hospital about Lucy, as is stated in the Erne Hospital notes. The telephone call was from Dr O'Donohoe. I agreed to Lucy being transferred to RBHSC. I arrived at the hospital before Lucy arrived. I have made a record in Lucy's hospital notes. Another emergency arrived and I transferred Lucy Crawford over to my colleague Dr Chisakuta at around 8.15am whilst I dealt with it. I can confirm that I received a transfer letter from Dr O'Donohoe regarding Lucy upon her arrival to RBHSC.
	In the telephone conversation with Dr O'Donohoe it is my recollection that there was a general discussion about treatment and the type of fluid she received, a dextrose based solution. I have no recollection of the volumes that he told me. I had no further dealings with Lucy following my handover to Dr Chisakuta.
	Detective Inspector Cross has asked me did any person attempt to influence me in any aspect regarding Lucy Crawford. My reply to this is no.
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
