I am a Health Visitor employed by Sperrin Lakeland Trust. I qualified as a Health Visitor in 1982. I have worked for Sperrin Lakeland Trust since October 1982 as a Health Visitor. I was the Family Health Visitor for Lucy Crawford. I carried out a primary visit about 14 days or so after Lucy was born, whenever the midwife stopped. I called with the Crawfords on a number of occasions in these first few months in line with normal health visiting practise. Lucy was a normal healthy baby and I had no concerns. The last contact with Lucy as a baby was around 7 months old to 9 months old when she had a developmental and hearing test. After Lucy died I remember calling at the home. I felt it was appropriate to call and offer support. I attended Lucy's funeral. The family were very devastated. I didn't have many visits with them. I was never given an explanation about Lucy's death to tell the family by anyone nor was I ever advised on what not to say. At no time was I ever given an explanation for Lucy's death. I have a vague memory of being asked by Marian Murphy, who is in charge of Health Visitors, asking me to call with the family purely on a support basis. I called on a few occasions only. D/Sergeant Cross has asked me if I ever discussed Lucy's death with Doctor O'Donohoe, Doctor Kelly, Doctor Anderson, Mr Fee or
