## RE: INQUIRY INTO HYPONATRAEMIA RELATED DEATHS- CLAIRE ROBERTS

In response to the Inquiry's letter HW-0064-12, dated 4<sup>th</sup> October 2012 and would advise, as follows:

The Trust has confirmed having contacted all three nurses referred to in your said letter.

Ms Margaret Jackson's recollection is that she was responsible for Theatres, Day Procedure Unit and Intensive Care (please refer to her signed statement, in this regard). She recalls that Barbara Moneypenny was responsible for Ambulatory Care and that Linda Surgenor was responsible for Wards and Night Sisters.

Ms Barbara Moneypenny's recollection is that she was responsible for A&E, Outpatients and play leader.

Ms Linda Surgenor's recollection is that she was responsible for the Day Care Unit, Knox Ward and Barbour Ward, i.e. surgical wards. She recalls that Sr Barbara Moneypenny was responsible for the medical wards, Allen Ward, Musgrave Ward, Outpatients and A&E. Her recollection is that Margaret Jackson was responsible for Theatres and PICU.

As you can see there is a clear disagreement between the above-named, as to who exactly had responsibility for the medical wards (including Allen Ward).

Unfortunately, the Trust has been unable to ascertain exactly who was responsible for which wards.
