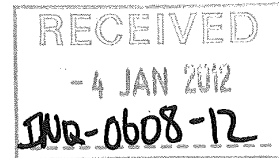

Providing Support to Health and Social Care



The Royal Belfast Hospital for Sick Children (RBHSC) is part of the Belfast Health and Social Care Trust. RBHSC is a 96 bed hospital which functions as a District General Paediatric Unit and in addition houses most of the Paediatric Regional specialities for Northern Ireland, including Endocrinology, Cystic Fibrosis, Neurology, Neurosurgery, Nephrology, Haematology, Cardiology, Child Psychiatry, Intensive Care, Paediatric and Neonatal Surgery, Trauma and Orthopaedics, Plastic Surgery and Burns, Respiratory Disease, Infectious Diseases, Oncology and Dentistry. The main hospital laboratory complex, including the Regional Paediatric Biochemistry Laboratory and Neonatal Screening Unit, Regional Endocrine Laboratory and Virus Reference Laboratory are a short distance away on site. Within RBHSC there are also Radiology, Dietetic, Physiotherapy, Speech and Language Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Clinical Psychology and Play Specialist Departments.

A new building opened in 1999 providing significantly upgraded accommodation for the A&E Department, Outpatient Department, Theatres and Intensive Care Unit and Medical Records Department.

The Regional Neonatology unit is located at the Royal Jubilee Maternity Hospital within the campus.

The Belfast Health and Social Care Trust is managed through a system of clinical and non-clinical Directorates of which Specialist Hospitals, Women & Child Health is one and RBHSC is managed within this. The Director, along with the Co-Directors, is responsible for the management arrangements within the Directorate. An Associate Medical Director is responsible for the Directorate and a Clinical Director is responsible for Medical and Surgical Specialities within RBHSC.
