### **Career Summary**

After my undergraduate training in UCD, I undertook three years of surgical posts before starting my anaesthetic training in Belfast. During my third year as a Senior Registrar, I transferred to Manchester and gained my CCST there in August 1997. I was then appointed as a Consultant Paediatric Anaesthetist in Manchester Children's Hospitals. I subsequently spent six months at the Hospital for Sick Children, Toronto undertaking a Fellowship in Paediatric Anaesthesia.

In 2001 I took a sabbatical to go for a period of training with Prof. Frank Shann at the Royal Children's Hospital, Melbourne, working in Paediatric Intensive Care for fourteen months. I returned to Manchester Children's Hospitals in June 2002 to work principally in Intensive Care.

I was the Lead Clinician for the Intensive Care Unit from May 2003 until I left Manchester in July 2005.
