Member of the World Federation of Hemophilia ⁽¹⁾ Executive Committee since 2002 and Vice President since 2004. Before joining WFH as a volunteer, I was a volunteer with the UK Haemophilia Society ⁽²⁾ where I latterly served as Vice Chair, and, more recently, served as President of the European Haemophilia Consortium ⁽³⁾, Treasurer of the Macfarlane Trust ⁽⁴⁾ and Financial Director of the Skipton Fund ⁽⁵⁾.

Note:

1. For nearly 50 years, the **World Federation of Hemophilia (WFH)** has provided global leadership to improve and sustain care for people with inherited bleeding disorders, including hemophilia, von Willebrand disease, rare factor deficiencies, and inherited platelet disorders.
2. Part of the role of the **UK Haemophilia Society** is to represent the interests of people affected by bleeding disorders and their families. This means that from time to time we make submissions to Government or respond to consultations.
3. The **European Haemophilia Consortium** today represents the needs of 43 countries in Europe and is primarily involved in monitoring and influencing European legislation concerning blood & blood products and in monitoring and maintaining standards of treatment and care for those with a bleeding disorder.
4. **The Macfarlane Trust** is a United Kingdom government sponsored charitable Trust for those people with haemophilia who contracted HIV infection.
5. **The Skipton Fund** is a UK Government funded corporate body established to recompense those who had contracted Hepatitis 'C' through their NHS treatment.
