## **Personal Statement**

I started my anaesthetic career in India in July 1995 at SMS Medical College, Jaipur. I obtained a MD in Anaesthesia and worked as a Registrar in a teaching hospital.

I moved to the UK in 2001 to continue my anaesthetic career. My first post was at Altnagalvin Area Hospital Londonderry in May 2001. Soon I joined Charles Waterton School of anaesthesia as Senior House Officer & then was appointed specialist registrar in the Stoke School of Anaesthesia in Sep 2003. I have completed all the core modules of training as published by the Royal College of Anaesthetists. This included 8 months in Intensive Care. I also spent three months for higher Paediatrics Module at Birmingham Children's Hospital.

I worked as locum Consultant in Anaesthesia & Pain Management at Warrington & Halton Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust since October 2008. This gave me an opportunity to go through the transition phase from being a trainee to the responsibility of a consultant. I have been involved in supervising trainees & middle grades directly or indirectly. I have been participating in on-call rota (1:12). I provide anaesthetics to variety of specialities which includes ENT, GI surgery, Gynae day case & weekly trauma list. Sometimes I do anaesthetise for other specialities like Urology, Orthopaedics, Ophthalmic etc to cover the absences of colleagues & waiting list initiatives.

In September 2009 I was successfully appointed as Consultant Anaesthetist on substantive post in the same dept.

## **TRAINING IN ANAESTHESIA & INTENSIVE CARE:**

### **In India:**

I started my anaesthetic career as a postgraduate trainee at SMS Medical College, Jaipur, a 1700 bedded multi-speciality tertiary referral hospital in North West India. Experience was foundation of what I have attained now. It included gradual progression from a novice anaesthetic trainee into super-speciality training. In the final year I lead a team of anaesthetic trainees. This also included a dissertation & exit exam.

I also worked as a Registrar in a large teaching hospital.

### **In United Kingdom:**

I have acquired training in all the core modules as required by the Royal College of Anaesthetists for the certification of completion of training (CCT). I have worked for eight months in intensive care where I gained extensive experience in peri-operative care of sick patients. I also gained good experience in the management of major trauma and head injured patients at University Hospital of North Staffordshire.

### **Paediatric Anaesthesia:**

I completed a three month higher training module in Paediatric Anaesthesia at Birmingham Children's Hospital which included 2 months in theatre and 1 month in paediatric intensive care. I gained much experience in understanding the principles of managing, stabilising and transferring a sick child during my stay in the intensive care.

I re-initiated the audit cycle of usage of Sevoflurane during my attachment & presented this audit.

### **Urology and Day Case Anaesthesia:**

I have acquired good training and experience in anaesthesia for adult and paediatric day surgeries. Success of day care involves good team work and I am confident to be part of that team. At various hospitals during rotational training, we perform lots of operations as day cases including Laparoscopic Cholecystectomy and Laparoscopic Nephrectomy. I have gained good experience in managing patients for various urological procedures both under supervision and independently.

### **Emergency and Trauma Anaesthesia:**

I have gained extensive experience in managing patients for emergencies in various specialities. The emergency lists are an opportunity to manage and prioritise the list by communicating effectively with the surgeons and theatre nurses, and is an invaluable in my development as an effective team leader. I did weekly trauma sessions in my current job which is a useful opportunity to maintain my skills in regional techniques including upper and lower limb blocks.

## **General & Colorectal Surgery**

Throughout my anaesthetic care I was involved anaesthetising patients for General & complex colorectal surgery. I was specifically attached to a consultant in Stafford General Hospital as my senior module for CCT & it was valuable experience. I continue to utilize these skills in my current job by doing two sessions every other week.

## **Obstetric Anaesthesia:**

I have also worked in the obstetric units at various hospitals during my rotational training as registrar & Senior House Officer.

I have obtained valuable experience in Obstetric Anaesthesia during my anaesthetic training in India.

I am proficient in various regional techniques like spinal, epidural and combined spinal epidural. I have performed 27 general anaesthetics for caesarean sections.

I am a member of the Obstetric Anaesthetic Association since 2004.

I have completed the Management of Obstetric Emergencies and Trauma (MOET) course in June 2007.

I initiated, completed & presented audit of provision of Epidural services during my attachment at Stafford General Hospital.

I provide an on call cover as Consultant Anaesthetist on 1:12 basis.



## **TRAINING IN CHRONIC PAIN:**

### **Advanced Training:**

- As one yr. fellowship, Out of Rotation training at The Walton Centre for Neurology & Neurosurgery, Liverpool.
- I satisfactorily completed this advanced training in Chronic Pain Management. This is a large and busy unit with 3 Pain consultants & one Professor in Pain Medicine. I have gained valuable experience in managing chronic pain patients.
- I undertook various pain assessment clinics and performed pain procedures both supervised & independently. I was regularly involved in the follow-ups of trial patients with pump implants & Spinal cord stimulators where I would assess the effectiveness & identify and manage any complications.
- The Walton Centre runs Pain Management Programme where I was involved in Clinical & Psychological assessment. Also I had run teaching sessions for the patients on the programme. I myself attended a week as a patient to understand it from other side of the table.
- Our dept. received a significant number of ward referrals from Aintree Hospital to advise them about in-patients with complex pain presentation & also acute on chronic pain problems.
- I was also involved in MDT approach towards the chronic pain & multi disciplinary team included pain physicians, psychologists, physiotherapists, pain nurses, occupational therapists & Neurosurgeons.
- I taught patients attending pain management programmes.
- I also developed Patient Information Leaflet about epidural for the patients in palliative care wards. I also wrote Patient Information Leaflet about Balloon compression of Gasserian Ganglion for Trigeminal Neuralgia.
- I was organiser of the Regional educational Meetings at Pain Relief Foundation in Liverpool.
- I also presented case reports, lectured & appraised journal.
- I participated in the Pain Services meetings every month.
- I try to read all the relevant recent articles in various anaesthetic journals. I regularly visit NICE & other websites for updates.

### **Basic Training:**

I have also had exposure in chronic pain dept. at University Hospital of North staffs & Pontefract General Infirmary. I developed interest in chronic pain during my anaesthetic training in India.

## **TEACHING EXPERIENCE:**

I enjoy teaching very much and have been fortunate to get lots of experience in my career.

### **Skills in Teaching:**

I have attended the **teaching methods workshop** conducted by the University of Wolverhampton in 2004. This workshop gave me insight into the basic principles of adult learning. It also helped me to improve my techniques and presentation skills.

### **Organising Teaching:**

I have organised the Research & Educational meetings at Pain Relief Foundation which is regularly attended by around 30 participants from various disciplines including pain physicians, Anaesthetists, GPsWI, physiotherapists, occupational therapists, neurosurgeons, Nurses etc. The attendees come from all over the region including North Wales. The presentations are either case reports or Lectures & are evidence-based &/or critically appraised. A written feedback is provided to all presenters.

My involvement was smooth running of the meetings & organizing the presenters' rota. I had successfully arranged two external expert speakers for the next yrs rota.

### **Teaching Undergraduates:**

I have taught medical students rotating through anaesthesia at Stafford Hospital, University Hospital of North Staffordshire both in theatres and in intensive care. I have also demonstrated procedures like venous and arterial cannulation, endotracheal intubations, and central venous catheterisation. I have attended the **assessment tools training study** day which enabled me to participate in assessing the foundation year doctors as part of the ongoing changes in modernising medical careers.

### **Teaching Postgraduates:**

I worked as Registrar in Anaesthesia in one of the big teaching hospitals in India which involved teaching postgraduate residents. I have been actively involved in all departmental teaching activities.

### **Skills as Examiner:**

I have been fortunate to be an examiner at the primary FRCA exam day for OSCE and viva run by Dr Gray at Mersey School of Anaesthesia.

I have also been mock examiner on final FRCA courses run by Stoke School of Anaesthesia.

I have endeavoured to pursue this role to enable trainees to pass their exams during their stay in this hospital by participating in Mock Minisets at Warrington Hospital.

### **Teaching other professionals:**

I teach and train the paramedics during their rotation through the Anaesthetic dept.

## AUDITS:

I have initiated all the following audits and have presented them at Clinical Governance meetings:

a) Audit of Sevoflurane usage in Birmingham Children's Hospital, Birmingham presented in local Audit meeting in Jul 2006 .Part of audit cycle started back in 2003. I pulled out the required data from ongoing audit forms & prepared the report using Microsoft excel. I also compared the results with earlier audit to get into the cycle. This was an eye opener that still wastage of expensive resources was continued.

b) Audit of Epidural Service provision in Obstetric unit of Stafford General Hospital. There is no separate provision for obstetric anaesthetist for out of hour services & on call anaesthetist covers ITU & Obstetric unit together. The service provision was compared with RCOA standards & results were presented.

c) Audit of Safety of Anaesthetic Machine at Stafford General Hospital. Machines were inspected across the trust against predetermined safety standards and results were presented in local Audit meeting in Mar 2006. Audit was well appreciated as it was done first time in the trust & was found to enhance safety precautions. They were introduced after this audit.

d) National audit of oxygen therapy prescribing from 2000 until 2003. I was involved from 2001 until 2003 & did a survey at national & local level .The team leader was Dr. de Mello, the consultant anaesthetist. Data Collection from all Anaesthetists in the trust & from all hospitals across the country through college tutors.We successfully closed the audit loop with introduction of prescription labels for oxygen therapy.

e) Audit of postoperative nausea & vomiting across the trust.2002

f) Audit of working hrs of SHO anaesthetics in Pontefract General Infirmary. I took this Project because structure of the trust I was working with was changing.It was planned that acute anaesthetist to be removed from Pontefract General Infirmary. This was a prospective study and I collected data from all of the 1<sup>st</sup> on call Anaesthetists. Continued requirement of acute anaesthetist was highlighted in audit meeting.

Retrospective & prospective survey of effect of Greater occipital N. blocks on various indications. Carried out at The Walton Centre for Neurology & Neurosurgery & results has been presented to British Pain Society as Poster Presentation in Annual Scientific Meeting 2008.
