RE: INQUIRY INTO HYPONATRAEMIA RELATED DEATHS- CLAIRE ROBERTS

I refer to the above matter and to your letter dated 11th September 2012, reference as quoted above.

My client has informed me that the Trust's ITC Department has, unfortunately, been unable to search the Trust's ITC system for the information which has been requested by you.

The Trust has recently been advised by a System Expert that in order to try to access the archived information, the Trust would have to ask the private company which originally supplied the system ('isoft') to obtain the information.

This would incur significant cost to the Trust and may not even produce the information which has been requested. My client has requested that, if the Inquiry still requires this information, that the Inquiry would consider being responsible for the costs of engaging such an independent expert.

In relation to the Clinical Coding Policies which were applicable at the time of the deaths of Claire Roberts and Lucy Crawford, the Trust's Coding Department has confirmed that the clinical coding policy would have been similar in 1996-2000. The actual reports for those years would not have been retained and they would not have been as detailed or developed, as they now are. At any rate, it must be noted that Coding Policies would not have had the same prominence from 1996-2000, as they now do today. Moreover, it should also be noted that most hospitals in Northern Ireland, at that time, would probably not have had any firm or comprehensive policy at all in relation to Coding.

This completes my client's response to your afore-mentioned letter.
