RE: INQUIRY INTO HYPONATRAEMIA RELATED DEATHS-RAYCHEL FERGUSON PRELIMINARY

I refer to the above matter and to your letter dated 1st May 2013. I am instructed as follows: -

- 1. The time to which you refer is the time that the request was generated on computer. If a request is computer generated it is assumed that the sample is taken from the patient at the same time, thus this time is recorded as the specimen time in the Laboratory Computer. If a request is manually generated and the specimen time is recorded on the request form, this can be manually entered into the Laboratory computer system by Laboratory staff.
- 2. If a specimen time is not recorded on a manual request then no time can be entered, only the specimen date.
- 3. It is possible to record the time on a blood chemistry report which is requested manually but only if the time is recorded on the manual request form.
- 4. The Trust is unable to confirm the reason why this was not done however it believes that the time was not recorded because either:
 - a) The time was not recorded on the manual request form by requestor; or
 - b) The time was recorded on the manual request form but was not entered onto laboratory computer by laboratory staff.
- 5. The results were available electronically at 4:26 on 13/4/2000 and practice at the time was to ring all urgent requests to the ward as soon as they became available. However at that time telephone records were not kept.
