## Re ROYAL PATHOLOGY LABORATORY DOCUMENTS

I refer to previous correspondence concerning this matter ending with your letter of 19 February 2013, in which you expressed concerns "arising from providing personal information to the Inquiry and in doing so acting contrary to the wishes of the Crawford family". In relation to those concerns, I make the following points:

Firstly the Chairman, after consultation with all interested parties, and taking account of the views of those who responded, decided in 2010 that under his interpretation of the revised terms of reference there will be an investigation into the events which followed Lucy's death, such as the failure to identify the correct cause of death, and whether more could have been learned from Lucy's death, because those events arguably contributed to the death of Raychel Ferguson in Altnagelvin. That decision was communicated to all parties including Mr and Mrs Crawford, in February 2010, and has been followed, without challenge by any party, since then. The papers from the Royal's Pathology Department are clearly relevant to the investigation of what happened after Lucy's death and the failure to identify the correct cause of death.

Given that the documents sought are integral to an investigation within the Inquiry's revised Terms of Reference we are somewhat surprised at the line which you have taken in relation to them, particularly since you have produced other documents relating to Lucy's treatment, diagnosis and death without objection. By way of example you have provided the clinical coding form and PAS Coding sent with your letters of 15 November 2012 and 26 March 2012 respectively and witnesses employed by your client have in the course of their witness statements answered questions about their parts in investigating the cause of Lucy's death without objection.

The Chairman is mindful of the Minister's decision to remove Lucy's name from the Inquiry's Terms of Reference. The Chairman has been and will at all times be sensitive to the privacy of the Crawford family to the greatest degree possible consistent with his decision. Mr and Mrs Crawford have been written to on a number of occasions to keep them informed of relevant developments. They have not responded in any way, either positively or negatively, to the Inquiry's correspondence.
