### 7. REVIEW OF HEALTH PROMOTION - DsPH 37/94

Dr Campbell said the review of the arrangements for health promotion had commenced, and should report by the end of December. She said Mr Brian Grzymek should be meeting DsPH shortly to discuss the matter. Dr Campbell added that the reason for the review was twofold: the statutory requirement for periodical review of all Government Agencies, and the need to review health promotion arrangements, flowing from the Report on the Purchasing Function.



### 8. STAR

Dr Hall said the method by which STAR monies were allocated within hospitals had been reviewed. Despite views that the new arrangements distort prices, the Department believes that those hospitals involved in undergraduate education and research have basic associated infrastructural costs throughout all departments, and the proposed arrangements were an attempt to address this.

Dr Hall said that as undergraduate education became increasingly community based, a "Community STAR" will need to be introduced. The University had been asked to produce a report outlining the anticipated rate and extent of change. In addition, the Cullyer Report recommends a separation of research service costs from other Health Service expenditure. The implications for STAR of this change, assuming the Cullyer Report was accepted, which seemed likely, would need to be examined. DsPH were content with the new arrangements for STAR allocations.


# 9. INTERNATIONAL STUDY OF ASTHMA AND ALLERGIES IN CHILDREN - DsPH 38/94








10. NEEDS ASSESSMENT FOR GENETIC SERVICES - DsPH 39/94


12. STAFF GRADE POST IN OPHTHALMOLOGY, ANTRIM HOSPITAL - DsPH 41/94
