



RE: INQUIRY INTO HYPONATRAEMIA RELATED DEATHS - RAYCHEL FERGUSON

I refer to the above matter and to your letter dated 7th May 2013.

I am instructed by the Belfast Trust that NCEPOD carry out Medical Governance themed audits into specific topics, including one into peri-operative care which took place in 2001. All data submitted to NCEPOD is anonymised and used for audit purposes only. NCEPOD does not have a role in investigating individual cases, rather they seek to audit performance based on identified cases as outlined in their inclusion criteria for any particular audit and make recommendations for future practice.

At this time, anonymised data was submitted directly by consultants who were identified by NCEPOD as suitable for inclusion in the audit. No record of data submitted would have (or should have been) kept in the patient record given the confidential nature of the enquiry. For this reason the Belfast Trust is unable to confirm whether any report regarding the death of Raychel Ferguson would have been made to NCEPOD.

The Trust now has, under NCEPOD's request, a NCEPOD Ambassador who plays a role in engaging clinicians in submitting audit forms for identified cases to any particular inquiry. However the general process of NCEPOD communicating directly with the clinician in a confidential manner remains the same and this data is then used in audit to make recommendations in respect of future practice.
