Legislative Overview of Health and Social Care Structures

The overarching structure of the existing integrated system of health and social care was initially introduced in the Health and Personal Social Services (Northern Ireland) Order 1972 (SI 1972/1265 (NI 14)). Article 16 of this Order provided the Department with the powers to establish, on 1st September 1972, four health and social services boards (SR 1972 No. 217):

- Northern Health and Social Services Board
- Southern Health and Social Services Board
- Western Health and Social Services Board
- Eastern Health and Social Services Board

Using powers in the Health and Personal Social Services (Northern Ireland) Order 1991 (SI 1992/194 (NI 1)), nineteen health and social services trusts, providing hospital and community services or ambulance services, were established on a phased basis from 1992 to 1998:

Review of Public Administration

On 1 August 2006, under the Review of Public Administration, 5 new trusts were established, to run in a shadow form with the existing hospital and community trusts. These new trusts remained co-terminous with the existing health boards:

Eastern HSS Board Belfast Health and Social Services Trust (SR 2006 No. 292)
South Eastern Health and Social Services Trust (SR 2006 No. 293)
Southern HSS Board Southern Health and Social Services Trust (SR 2006 No. 294)
Northern HSS Board Western HSS Board Western Health and Social Services Trust (SR 2006 No. 295)

The 18 previous hospital and community trusts were subsequently dissolved on 1st April 2007 (SR 2007 No. 132).

The Northern Ireland Ambulance Service HSC Trust was unaffected by this change.

RPA led to further restructuring in 2009, with the necessary legislative changes brought forward in the Health and Social Care (Reform) Act (Northern Ireland) 2009 (c.1 (NI)). This provided for a number of structural changes, which took effect from 1st April of that year. Existing health boards were dissolved (section 1 of the Act), with their functions transferred to, and separated between, the Regional Agency for Public Health and Social Well-being (health improvement and health protection functions) and the Regional Health and Social Care Board (other functions) (section 24 of the Act).
