1. Describe in detail your role in the care of Adam prior to his transplant surgery, including preparing him for that surgery.

I was the Staff Nurse who admitted Adam Strain to Musgrave Ward, RBHSC on the 26th November 1995 at 9pm as a possible donor kidney had been found for him. As the admitting nurse I recorded his temperature, pulse, blood pressure and weight. I took a patient history and noted his current medication (057-011-015, 057-012-016 and 057-013-017,018).

Adam was given 180mls of clear fluid per hour through his gastrostomy tube and 20mls of IV fluids (intravenous fluids) per hour (057-010-013,014).

At 1.30am Adam's IV Cannula tissued. Dr O'Neill was informed and his clear fluids via gastosomy were increased to 200mls per hour (057-014-019).

At 2am I gave Adam 240mg of paracetamol via his gastrostomy tube (057-021-033,034 and 057-022-035).

Adam had his normal peritoneal dialysis overnight which was stopped at 6am as per doctors order. Adam was transferred to theatre at 7am. Although his patient notes say that he had his cannula reinserted at 5am I have a vague memory of the doctor having difficulty in inserting this and Adam going to theatre without IV access being obtained (057-014-019).
