 - (iii) any inquiries made by you or examination of Raychel carried out by you before the prescription was given.


On 8th June 2001 I was working as a paediatric medical SHO. At some stage on that morning, I cannot recollect precisely when, it would appear from the record 020-019-038, that I was requested by one of the nursing staff to continue prescribing fluids for a child, Raychel Ferguson. If I had been asked to see the child due to any concerns the nursing staff had, I would have examined her. If I had examined her I would have recorded my findings in the clinical records. Therefore if there is no record of me seeing the child in the clinical records that means I did not examine the child on 8th June 2001. I cannot state that the request was made by SN Rice nor can I state that the request was made at 12.10pm. Although I have no recollection of what I was told, I assume that I would have been informed that the child had her appendix out during the night and that she needed continuing fluids. I am not sure if I checked the chart to ascertain what the fluids the child was receiving or whether I was told by the nursing staff. All that can be stated is that on some stage on the morning of the 8th June 2001, I prescribed solution 18, 1 litre to be infused at a rate of 80ml per hour and filled in "1000" under amount, "soln 18" under the type of fluid "80" under rate per hour and signed the chart 020-019-038.

One of the inquiries I probably would have made is to ascertain how long it was after surgery as I would have been concerned if the child had been on fluids for more than 24 hours after surgery. I would also have inquired as to the general condition of the child. I cannot recollect the nursing staff expressing any concerns about the child. If they had done so I would have examined the child. The policy at that time in Altnagelvin Area Hospital was that if paediatric patients needed fluids the fluids prescribed were solution 18. I had no paediatric experience in any other hospital prior to commencing work in Altnagelvin Area Hospital.
